




Beginning of Growing Season vs End of the Growing Season

Low Flow Year




North Aurora




Composite Sample


Flows used for Sediment Model:

Red = Erosion Blue = Deposition





Montgomery

- Strong local interest a series of riffles to replace the dam





Montgomery Alternative Comparisons



Big Questions 1

Is there funding still available?

OWR Available Funding

- Public Act 103-0589 Article 143, Section 75
 - For "publicly owned dams...including dam removals....ensure reduced risk of injury to the public"
 - \$19,731,014 available for:
 - North Aurora
 - Montgomery
 - Other 519 dam projects
 - Other non-519 dam projects

What about the USACE?

OWR assumes (the best) this is a temporary delay and the schedule will see little to no impact

OWR Planning (the worse) we will continue our assessment of with priority give to state owned dams

OWR still needs to determine the long-term plans for all State-owned dams.

Big Questions 2

Will the cost to modify utility crossings be covered with federal and/or state funds?

Other Questions

How much sediment upstream?

What will it look like in 1, 2, 5 years?

When would communities need to commit to secure state funds?
